

Letter from your church Richard Langridge

With the days drawing in, it seems the world is simply taking a pause, before the headlong rush to Christmas. All our churches already have their services planned and the carols drawn up, and it will be only a matter of time before the trees are up and the churches decorated. They may look a little different from

the way they were first decorated – if they existed at all - in the Middle Ages before Prince Albert and the fir tree and tinsel came in, when literally local churches were covered with the holly and the ivy stripped from local hedgerows and hundreds of bees-wax candles lit a space unburdened with pews or chairs. It must have felt very different with the service in Latin and no bible on display. Then we even had a time when Christmas itself officially did not exist, when Parliament banned the practice of celebrating Christmas for sixteen years from 1644 under the English Republic.


Yet I have experienced a number of Christmases that did indeed feel very different. I'm sure many of us have on occasion been away from home for work or for personal reasons in places where Christmas felt, well, odd. The oddest I ever experienced was in Libya where I was working teaching English and I celebrated it with a small group of other expats sitting in a tent in the Sahara desert. Somehow someone had even managed to find a small, rather dilapidated artificial Christmas tree and we ate turkey with cranberry jelly, cross-legged on mats, too hot to go outside.

That Christmas, in Ghaddafi's Libya, was a Christmas without God, at least in an official Christian form. Yet while Libyans didn't recognize Christmas as a holy day, Jesus was celebrated, not as the Son of God or the Messiah, but as a wise prophet. When I subsequently worked in Malaysia, the multi-faith, coalition government decreed that all the major religious days should be secular public holidays for everyone. Simply sharing the celebratory aspects of each other's festivals was a great way of bringing people together and a policy the British Government might wish to follow!

The irony is that for the vast majority of British people in 2023 it will be a Christmas without God. I can't be the only person who notices how so few of the advent calendars now have a religious theme or how few of us feel comfortable sending overtly religious Christmas cards to people we know don't go to church.

But does it matter? I happen to think a Christmas day with no mention of the man who made it is a tad peculiar, but maybe not. Because the message of Christmas is of Christ himself; of love, of tolerance, and of inclusion. We can all think of areas in the world where more of that would go a long way. And to many of us who aren't religious, by helping others, thinking of those less fortunate than ourselves and demonstrating kindness and love, we will be acting out the Christian message, whether we realise it or not.

So whatever your faith, or none - have a very Happy Christmas!


Review Martyn Percy has spent a lot of his ministry in academic circles, but in this book he wears his learning lightly.







Bledlow Ridge Cricket Club

It being winter, there's not much cricket going on at the club just now (!). Our outfield has been reseeded and thanks to everyone for staying off the area. It's tempting to play informal games like football on the outfield but doing so in a wet winter could undo the

good work so we would appreciate your continued support.

As ever the club is on the lookout for new players for next season (indoor nets will start in February) and for anyone who would like to umpire or score a few games for us. We can be contacted via www. bledlowridgecricketclub.co.uk or just email me on j.rolfe444@btinternet.com.

Meantime, a few notes on the history of the club, the ground and the "Ridge Bears", some of which has only become known in recent weeks.

Firstly, why "Ridge Bears"? Back in the mid 1990's, lan Bailey (Bails), a player and

son of the Village Postmaster, was growing into a slightly chubby teenager. Because of this, he was christened the Ridge Bear by Simon Bird and the name stuck. A few years later, Russ Moran, a player and committee member, decided to produce a newsletter for the club. He chose to call it The Ridge Bear.

Around the year 2000 the club needed to recruit players and as part of this it was felt the club should re-brand. Another player, Henry Hale (Henners), chose the Ridge Bear. He borrowed a logo from the

Chicago Bears and added it to the club's first branded shirts and caps. Since then, it has become core to the club's identity and profile, culminating in the carving of the RidgeBear in 2021.

What about the ground itself? In August a good Friday evening crowd attended an event when Peter Malaure unveiled a new blue plaque on the pavilion, following research by former Chairman Mike Beattie. Peter is one of only a few people (or perhaps the only person) who remembers Reginald Johnston who gifted the ground in trust in 1954. The conveyance names the field as Meadow Stiles, which with the passage of time has become Meadow Styles. The large oak tree near the entrance to the field is thought to have been planted back in 1841. The previous ground was where Tudor Stud Farm now stands. Mr Johnston died in 1961 and is buried in Bledlow Ridge churchyard.

In addition to the blue plaque there is also a plague inside the clubhouse which incorporates the Johnston coat of arms. This is probably that of Clan Johnston, thought to emanate from the southwest of Scotland from where a catholic branch fled to Ireland to escape the reformation.

Finally, when was cricket first played at Bledlow Ridge? Well, the original letterhead states "est 1919", however research a few years ago revealed some cricket was played in 1892 and this date has been adopted as our founding year. There is evidence however that a cricket team represented the Ridge in a match in 1831. Further research is needed and there may be more to report in future editions of Contact.

As a footnote should be said that "Bails" grew up to be extremely handsome and athletic. At least that is what he would have us believe!

Bledlow Ridge Tennis Club

By the time you read this, the installation of floodlights should have completed on two of our courts. This is a huge step forward for the club as it means that we can offer much more court time, particularly for those who are at school or work during the week, and it means we can host league matches at home. The lights are LED and highly directional meaning there will be low energy consumption and minimal light spill. The lights will automatically turn off at 9.30pm to comply with our planning permission.

This is the culmination of eighteen months work including seeking planning permission, visiting other clubs' facilities, interviewing suppliers, and running a procurement The funding has been made exercise. possible by one of our members doing a sponsored run to raise money for us, and Bledlow-cum-Saunderton from Parish Council, The North-west Chilterns Community Board, Heart of Bucks, Bucks Tennis, and the Aylesbury and District League; not to mention the highly successful Auction of Promises.

We're also delighted to have launched clubbranded kit - we now have shirts, shorts, caps, hoodies and skirts for sale marked with the tennis club logo, and the tennis club gets a cut of every sale. If you fancy one of these, just head to our website.

We've arranged two doubles coaching sessions with Sam Frost from JWT Coaching which are proving very popular. Rather than being focussed on technique, these will help our players with their positioning and tactics during matches. One of these is on a Monday evening - we're delighted to be able to immediately start using our floodlights.

Notes from Bradenham Parish Council 13th November

The parking situation in High Wycombe was discussed as there is little enforcement present. Cllr Etholen will take this up with parking enforcement officers.

Potholes in Rectory Lane: BCC had promised some years ago to fix the potholes once the flood and drainage problems had been sorted. The National Trust has done a lot of work with new run offs and clearing old ones on Bradenham Hill which has stopped Rectory Lane flooding. The large potholes on Rectory Lane now need to be repaired. The Clerk will send any correspondence with the Local Area Technician to BC Cllr. Adoh and report the issue on "Fix my street".

Quotes are being sought for the repair of the parish noticeboard. The condition of the hedges and footway on the A4010 between the Old Rectory and Avering Down Farm were discussed. The clerk will write to the landowner about the hedges whose responsibility this is. The footway has a dual use for cycling and walking and should bemaintained by BCC to encourage walking and cycling.

The next meeting of the Parish Council would be held on January 15th 2024, starting at 7pm in the Cricket Club.


Christmas day bring the family and their newly opened presents to the Christmas day service where we celebrate the gift to us all of the Christ Child.

News from your Parish Council



Everyone on the Parish Council would like to wish you and your family a Very Good Christmas and a Healthy and Happy New Year.

We hope that the weather is favourable for the Annual Festive Fayre on 6th December and a big thank you to the West Wycombe Events Team for organising this. From St Paul's Church with its Christmas Tree Festival and on through the High Street there will be something for everyone.

The Parish Council would also like to thank all the volunteers within our community who regularly pick up litter in the community. Sadly it is nearly always food and drink items which people seem to just drop or throw out of their car windows. Recently we have had a spate of Fly Tipping of animal related items in the Pedestal Playing Field Car Park – dog beds, pet cages etc – why do people not just take them to High Heavens?

Our usual annual plea is for everyone who has a hedge on their boundary with the pavement to make sure that the hedge is cut back to your boundary. This is the perfect time of year to undertake this work and there are several properties along the Chorley Road who do need to address this issue. A pavement should be clear and wide enough for a double buggy or a wheelchair to pass along easily. This guideline should also be taken into account when parking a vehicle on a pavement.

The Parish Council is currently working on the annual budget for 2024/2025. Our plan is not to increase the Precept, this is the amount of money that Buckinghamshire Council provides to parishes in order that they can undertake the work and provide the facilities necessary for their community. We are very aware of the current financial constraints on everyone and do not want to add to that worry or burden on our residents. The West Wycombe precept form part of the Council Tax bill. You will also see Special Expenses for West Wycombe on our bills. This is nothing to do with the Parish Council; it is what Buckinghamshire Council charge all of us in this parish to look after St Lawrence Closed Churchyard – it is a strange quirk in law that when a churchyard is closed it is no longer maintained by the Church of England but is passed over to the local authority.

We are looking ahead as we have advised the Pageant Master that we would like to be one of the official beacons to commemorate the 80th Anniversary of the D Day landings on 6th June next year.

This may well be my last article for Contact as the Parish Clerk; still too early to tell how we have progressed in the recruitment process. I have enjoyed my very interesting and varied time as a Parish Clerk over the last 28 years and I hope my replacement will find it as rewarding as I have.


