Letter from your church Revd Anne Cooper

I was working some years ago in the parish of Compton in Surrey and taking my first Remembrance Day service. There were two things that stood out for me that day. The first was this - as the service in church ended we opened the doors for the procession to the War Memorial which was just across the

road from the church. As we came outside we saw the villagers waiting for us to join them and begin the Act of Remembrance. I remember thinking how sad that they hadn't made the step into church but how lovely to see them in their numbers. A bit of a conflict going on in my mind.

The second was seeing the Brigadier who was to take the salute standing so very still and readying himself for the occasion. I was impressed with this individual who was still able to fit into his uniform at the age of 80+ including spurs. He looked so smart and everything that engenders remembrance was in this silent, upright, dignified, gentleman.

I find myself thinking now of the small wooden crosses that families place in the ground around the memorials and will go on placing every year; each one a memory with so much inside. They will lie alongside the wreaths representing the larger groups, the British Legion, The WI etc each village having its own groups. Many of you will watch on television as the King takes the salute at the Cenotaph in London probably remembering his own dear mother.

This year as in past years all will be re-laid and ceremonies completed and we will mark the passing of time and stop for a moment.

Remember that your churches are here for you because this is where it all makes sense. To know that those loved ones are still in Gods loving care. A God who may seem distant to you and always blamed for each sadness but whose only Son suffered and died to save a way home for us all.

We pray for an end to war as we do every year - somehow it seems more important this year but pray also for strength to get through the winter months and to stay safe and warm as we long for the days to grow shorter.

Into this quarter of the year have come sadness of war and conflict still with us but into this quarter we also have light which each year we bring deliberately to help us through the dark months. The churches in our Benefice will be holding All Souls services. This will be an opportunity to light candles for those who have been lost and for us who remain to remember them. Look out for the timings of each service in this issue and on Facebook.

Those young at heart will enjoy Bonfire Night and the fireworks displays that are so well organised. Watch out for your pets and those with PTSD who dread the occasion. We need our Festivals and we need to remember but we also need to look after each other through these times. Take a moment to seek out neighbours to make sure they are safe to offer words of forgiveness or encouragement, just because we are community.

May God bless you in all your villages and keep you safe.



We begin on 1st November by celebrating All Saints and remembering the way in which women and men throughout the ages have lived lives that demonstrated the way of Christ. 
Nature Notes

Autumn saw us on a trip to the coast, seal breeding season in the UK which is home to about 40% of the world's grey seal population, and Pembrokeshire's secluded bays are ideal for them. Females return to the beach where they were born to give birth to their own creamy furred pups.After about three weeks the pups have moulted and are ready to fend for themselves. Battlescarred males wait for their chance to fight again for dominance of the bay and mating rights. As seal calls echoed up from the beaches below, swallows whizzed around the cliffs after flies, gannets plunge-dived into the sea to catch fish, and aerobatic choughs with their matching red legs and beaks accompanied our cliff top walks.

The ladies' and mixed winter league matches have also started. Since the mixed league matches are played on weekday evenings, we normally play our "home" matches at our opposition's courts – but with our floodlights arriving in November, we look forward to being able to host winter matches on our own courts.

We are very pleased to have been invited to take part in the Bucks Tennis centenary celebration tournament in November and aim to send a mixed pair to play at this fun event at Bucks Indoor Tennis Centre. 

Recipe Chutney Spirals of Joy



From Bianca at The Clubhouse Cafe

Ingredients I sheet ready roll puff pastry I large packet / bunch coriander I/2 a packet mint I small red onion 2 green finger chillies juice of I lime 2 tsp cumin powder or seeds I tsp salt I Tbsp mild flavoured oil 100 g grated cheddar I egg, beaten

Possibly the greatest thing you could ever do with a roll of puff pastry. Purists feel free to make your own pastry, but I'm firmly in the "who has the time for that" camp. If you are looking for a less processed ready to go pastry sheet, try the All Butter ones in M&S.

These punchy rolls of delight are a fusion of East meets West - the crispy, light puff pastry wrapping itself around a bright sour, spicy and fragrant mix of herbs and cuddling up to some soothing cheddar. My lovely uncle used to make a similar filling for all his parties. If there wasn't a cheese and chutney sandwich, was it even a party?!

They are super easy to make - you'll need a blender for ease, but you could chop everything up by hand. Feel free to adjust the spice level by adding / reducing the amount of chilli. Don't like coriander? You could use parsley though I have to confess I've never tried that.

- I/Take your pastry roll out the fridge so that it is easy to unroll. Don't do what (often!!)I do and leave it in the fridge until you need to use it and discover that the roll doesn't unroll without looking like a geological crisis has occurred.
- 2/ In your blender bung in the coriander (the whole big bunch), about half a bunch or a small packet of mint (it's better if you remove the leaves from the stems,) a small onion roughly chopped, the juice of a lime, a teaspoon of salt, 2 green finger chillies, 2 teaspoons of cumin

(you can use ground or seeds) and about a tablespoon of mild tasting oil.

- 3/ Whizz it all up until it is fairly finely blitzed.... the smell is amazing! I highly recommend you sample the mix at this stage, so that you can adjust the salt / spice / sour level according to your palate. Remember that the spice will be tempered by the pastry and the cheese.
- 4/ Leave it in the blender while you attend to the cheese...you just need to roughly grate about 100g.

- 5/ Roll out your puff sheet, you want it landscape with the longest edge at the top. Spread out your blitzed herby mixture on the pastry, leaving about a cm gap at the top, then sprinkle the grated cheese on top of the herb mix.
- 6/ Get your beaten egg and brush the uncovered strip of pastry with it, before rolling the filling covered pastry up - roll towards the gap, as tightly as you can.
- 7/ Cut your roll into 8, slather the outside and tops of the rolls with the remainder of the egg, and pop them spiral side up on a baking tray, leaving gaps between them so they can do their puffy thing.
- 8/ Pop them into preheated oven, for half an hour.... they should come out looking delightfully burnished and smelling like heaven. Try not to eat all of them at once!

Our next service will be the Benefice Eucharist on October 22nd, followed by the Remembrance Day service on the 12th of November, starting at 10.50 by the lychgate.

It was disappointing that the Harvest Supper could not take place because of the plastering work. This is ongoing and the scaffolding will be back again !

The vacancy for a rector has been advertised again. In the meantime, we are very grateful to the priests who continue to share services between them.

Notes From Bradenham Parish Council

state of the pavements in High Wycombe were brought to Cllr. Etholen's attention. There is little parking enforcement at present; this will be taken up with parking enforcement officers.

It is acknowledged that investment in High Wycombe is needed. Cllr. Rachel Matthews has been appointed Deputy Cabinet Member for Town Centre Regeneration. Various hedges in the parish that needed trimming had been brought to the clerk's attention. These are being brought to the attention of the landowners and to others responsible to hedges. The clerk had completed the BC survey on Devolution; the PC is happy with the arrangement although the funds provided by BC are not sufficient for the work that needs to be carried out.

The clerk had written to the NT about the clearing of run off on Bradenham hill; and requested that NT ask their tenants and contractors not to park on the pavement where they have been blocking the pavement.

Due to the fact that the dog bin in Bradenham village is overflowing at times, the PC has decided to purchase a larger bin, provided the contractor can handle the larger size.

The PC has objected to the demolition of the Willow Barn in Walters Ash and the construction of a replacement building.

The next meeting of the PC will be on 13th November in the cricket club pavilion at 7pm.All are welcome.





News from your Parish Council



We currently have two allotment plots vacant – if you are interested in taking one on at either $\pounds 30$ for a full plot or $\pounds 15$ for a half plot please contact the Clerk.

Do you want to serve your community and work in West Wycombe? If you do, we could have the job for you, as the Parish Council is looking for a new Clerk.

Our Clerk, Sharon Henson, is retiring after 28 years working for West Wycombe Parish Council. There is an advert for the role in this issue of Contact, and it is also on our website and our Facebook page.

For anyone thinking of applying, here is more information on what is involved in being a Parish Clerk, and Sharon's view on the role:

It is a part-time role, working from home with some evening meetings working for a legally constituted body as a tier of local government.

Our parish starts at the beginning of the houses in Bradenham Road, from Myze Farm and the Piddington parish sign on the A40, from Bottom Lane and along Chorley Road and along West Wycombe Road and down Chapel Lane on the right-hand side until you get to Toweridge Lane.We are in the Chilterns Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty and the Green Belt, and the centre of the parish comes under the Conservation Area.

There are regular monthly activities, for example, producing an agenda and accounts and relevant papers, putting them on the noticeboards, attending the monthly Parish Council meetings in the evening and producing the minutes, undertaking the work created by the minutes as well as keeping the website and Facebook page up to date. There is also this Contact article to write every month! Councillors are consulted on planning applications and their comments have to be submitted to Buckinghamshire Council within a specified timeframe.

We have a burial ground, allotments, and the Pedestal Playing field to manage as well as our Buckinghamshire Devolved Services Highways contract for the areas within the 30mph speed limits. These three areas can present different management issues at different times of the year and at any time.We are also responsible for all the streetlights along Chorley Road and Bradenham Road, and some within the village.

We work closely with Buckinghamshire Council, West Wycombe Estate, and The National Trust.

On a day-to-day basis there will be interaction with our residents, providing them and those of adjoining communities with information on such things as streetlights not working, bus pass renewal, bins not being emptied, and a variety of other matters which come under Buckinghamshire Council, and where people do not understand that we no longer have a Wycombe District Council and need help. There are regular meetings to attend for Clerks to get up-to-date information on what Buckinghamshire Council are undertaking, as well as the Local Government Association.

In the 28 years I have been Clerk, the Parish Council has been responsible for creating the pelican crossing along West Wycombe Road, the zebra crossing in the High Street, installing the streetlights mentioned above and subsequently converting them to LED lights; involved in the lighting installed in the High Street; created the pavement from the High Street up to the school; created the allotments: created the burial ground; created the Pedestal Playing Field; developed the Community Orchard in the land above the Burial Ground: installed the Vehicle Activated Signs at the entrance to the village on Oxford Road, the ones either side of the railway bridge in Bradenham Road, and the ones at either end of Chorley Road. We spent 4 years working on safety measures for Bradenham Road, going to parliament to apply for funding from the fund for communities affected by HS2 but not benefitting from the railway line, and currently we are working on a safety scheme for the High Street.

We are also responsible for contacting residents and businesses if they have overhanging trees and hedges, and giving approval for the erection of signs along the verges or removing those which are not relevant to our parish. We organise litterpicks, events in conjunction with other groups in the community, the Christmas trees and lights, and do our very best to make West Wycombe Parish a good place to live.

It is a unique 'job' in that it is extremely varied, using all sorts of skills, and I have enjoyed my time serving this community.
