### **News from St Paul's Church**

As March begins we are already well into Lent going on to Holy Week and then celebrating Easter and the resurrection on the last day of the month.

During Lent we make a special effort to draw nearer to God either by testing our self-discipline by giving something up or by making space for more prayer or bible reading or reading a theological book. The church of England is helping us this year by providing the leaflet Watch and Pray. It gives a short reading and meditation for each day and then encourages us to watch more closely to see where God is working in our lives and goes on to lead us into prayer. If you would like a copy and have not yet got one, please speak to Anne or Veronica or one of the churchwardens.

Our leaflets are based on the Archbishop of Canterbury's Lent Book Tarry Awhile by Selina Stone. Tarrying is a Black Christian spiritual practice which answers 'yes' to the question Jesus once asked his disciples. Whether in the vibrancy of music and singing, or in hushed silence, people of all ages actively wait for an encounter with God that will transform what we know, what we feel and what we experience day to day.

Everyone in the benefice is invited to come to our church of St Paul here on Bledlow Ridge to share any issues that may have been raised by the leaflets. Thursdays 7th, 14th and 21st March at 7.30pm. Veronica will try to add anything from the book that helps our understanding of the week's theme. Each meeting will start with coffee

and chat and go on to end with Compline and a time of silence. We will aim to finish by 9.00pm.

The last week of March will be kept as Holy Week. Sunday 24th March is Palm Sunday and we meet at Bradenham at 11.00am to remember Jesus' entry into



Jerusalem knowing that the crowd who celebrate him now will soon turn against him. On Thursday we gather at West Wycombe at 6.30pm as Jesus met with his disciples to have supper with them for the last time. He called them to serve one another after his example of washing their feet and asked them to remember the way in which he gives his life for them by sharing bread and wine.

On Good Friday we gather at Bradenham at II.00am to follow the traditional Stations of the Cross walking with Jesus as he



carries his cross to the place of execution where he is nailed to the cross and gives up his life for us.

Then it is Easter Sunday, we sing Alleluia and share the joy of knowing that Jesus has conquered death and bought eternal life for all of us.

Hundreds of twittering finches gather in bare winter treetops. We hear bullfinches sing, they are elusive so it's a delight when you do spot the astonishingly rosy pink chest. Stonechats are not tree birds, posts are high enough perches for them and they nest near the ground: there are two pairs below Lodge Hill. Long-tailed tits, puffs of blush feathers with black and white highlights, "tut" as they flit along hedgerows.

Near Sprigs Holly we saw two foxes a few minutes apart, probably a pair because they barked and responded to each other. We heard one rustling closer in the leaf litter, it froze as soon as it saw us. Time stood still for those few moments until it turned away and vanished back into the woods.

# **News from St Botolph's Church**

St. Botolph's remains beautiful always and looks even better now that the chancel and beneath the tower have been replastered. Our paintings of the Stations of the Cross are being rehung in the correct order in readiness for our service on Good Friday.

Our lovely tree, generously provided by the National Trust, has come down, as have the evergreens which were put in place before Christmas. It was very pleasing to have so many people in the congregation for our services on Christmas Eve, and to chat with so many over mulled wine after the services. St. Botolph's is a very welcoming place and is becoming more and more used. We know there are visitors during the week who come in for rest and contemplation; everyone is always very welcome. Bot's Books remains popular, as does the supper shared on 'reading ' nights. We also host history groups and others interested in our church. The church recorders have almost finished recording all the details of our church, including the textiles and the stained glass windows. The finished product will be a wonderful record of this splendid building.

Our church wardens will be pleased to hear from other groups wishing to bring groups. Their contact details are in the front of this newsletter. We are fortunate to have such active people; they do an enormous amount for us all. Pete and Jean Baldwin care for the graveyard, which is just springing in to life and of which we are very proud.

A special date for the diary is a service on Good Friday to commemorate the Stations of the Cross. (Friday 29th March I lam) The congregation move around the church following the path of Christ from Pilate's palace to the place of execution. This is made very special in Bradenham as the church has a set of water colour paintings from the 1930's depicting Christ's progress.

Lastly all welcome to celebrate Easter on Sunday 31st at 11am and there might even be an Easter Egg hunt afterwards!!!

One tiny nugget to ponder: When Jesus was interrogated by Pilate, he spoke Aramaic whereas Pilate spoke, we assume, only Latin. So there must have been a translator. mustn't there?

### Bradenham cricket club

Bradenham Cricket club is a long established and integral part of the village. We play 2 Saturday teams in the Kookaburra Mid Bucks cricket league, starting April through to early September. We are fortunate to play our home games in an area of outstanding natural beauty, and you would be hard pushed to find a more picturesque setting to play cricket.

Our indoor nets are held at Cressex Community School from 4th

February 9.00 till 11.00 for 9 weeks. Costs are £10 adults and £5 for under 18s.

### **Notes from Bradenham Parish Council**

At its January meeting the Council set the 24/25 budget and precept ( the money we ask for from Buckinghamshire Council) to pay for the functioning of the Parish Council. It has been necessary to ask for £9,059 in 24/25 in order to balance the books. This amount will be identified on your council tax bill. The increase is mainly due to increased charges for grass cutting in the 30mph zone. We also need to budget for a third dog bin. This service is the responsibility of the parish council.

We have budgeted for a village fete again; always a popular event. We always need to put money aside for maintenance. The Parish Council has kept its precept virtually unchanged in recent years, thereby reducing our reserves; obviously we cannot continue to do this indefinitely. The Council has decided to put a Biodiversity policy in place even though it does not own any land. The Council does, however, maintain the pond and will take it into account when commenting on planning applications.







### The Alaskan Gold Rush



The rush to find gold and make your fortune in Nome, Alaska is not as well known as the Klondike rush which came before it. The Klondike had previously attracted thousands of prospectors, known as 'stampeders'.



The 1896 Klondike Gold Rush was in Canada's **Territory** centered around Dawson City. By 1899 some stampeders were still there either eking out a living doing odd jobs or

working for established mines, their dreams of wealth dashed. They were either too poor or too embarrassed to go home.

However in the Spring of 1899 rumours were spreading of a new gold strike in Alaska. That summer over 8,000 people abandoned Dawson for the new find in Nome. The credit for this strike was down to three men who became known as the 'Three Lucky Swedes' (even though one of them, Jafet Lindberg, was actually Norwegian). Prospectors set about staking claims on Anvil Creek & tributaries of the Snake River. The Anvil Creek strike was good but it led to an even better discovery. Those stampeders who arrived too late to stake a claim set up their tents on the beach at the mouth of the Snake River, here they made an amazing discovery - there was gold on the beach.

For the average stampeder the beaches had a distinct advantage although the season wasn't long - due to the ice they could only be worked from June to October. Even so they could not be staked, so claims were open to everyone. Also the prospectors did not have to haul their finds over narrow mountain passes and could now easily be reached by boats. All they needed was a shovel, a bucket & a rocker in order to separate the gold from the sand – the rush was on again!

Things couldn't last of course and by 1909 the population had plummeted to 2,600 folk - the rush was over!

Commercial mining still occurs in Nome though and every year independent optimistic prospectors still turn up to look for that elusive yellow metal.

# **News from your Parish Council**

As I write this piece in early February we have not yet found a replacement Clerk, so I will continue in the role for as long as is necessary. Parish Councils are legally constituted bodies and have to function efficiently and continuously for the benefit of their residents.

We have for many weeks tried to resolve the flooding issue near Kitty's Lodge, now made worse by rising groundwater levels. We hope that by the time you read this a solution will have been found. We have highlighted the issue of the area becoming an ice rink in freezing weather, that the school children and all pedestrians, if they don't want to get soaked, are being forced to cross at the Pedestal Roundabout which is not easy when all drivers are concentrating on the roundabout traffic and do not readily let people cross and that if you walk along the verge it has become a quagmire.

We will be holding our annual Spring Litter Pick on Saturday 13th April from 9.30 – 12 noon. We will be based in West Wycombe Village Hall and high viz jackets and equipment will be supplied. Tea and home made cake will be available. We look forward to seeing you.

Residents in West Wycombe Village who must use plastic bags for waste and recycling collection will be pleased to know that a delivery should have happened already but if not, then it is due in March. We used to receive a delivery twice per year, but this has now changed to just in March.

The Clerk has had a face to face meeting with the local highways manager and supplied a long list of all the outstanding work which should have take place in our parish – everything has been reported on Fix My Street and the contractors who took over the work last April have actually undertaken almost double the amount of work.

Since the sale of The Church Room our meetings have taken place in West Wycombe Community Library and we will continue to meet here unless we expect more people to attend - for example, the Annual Parish Meeting will be held in the Village Hall.

Our dates for meetings in 2024 are as follows: I4th March, I1th April, 9th May, 23rd May – Annual Parish Meeting, I3th June, I1th July, 8th August (if required), I2th September, I0th October, I4th November, and I2th December.
