Welcome ...

The Roman Catholic church has just elected a new Pope. He has been hailed as the first American pope although he left America at the age of 27 to serve as a missionary in Peru and later gained dual citizenship. He worked there as a priest in the Order of St Augustine, eventually becoming Bishop. In 2023 he was called back to the Vatican to work with Pope Francis and was made a cardinal.

His first words as Pope were of 'Peace to all' and called us to build bridges.

The Archbishop of York said in a statement that he "shared in the joy" of the Roman Catholic Church and would be "praying for the new Pope as he takes on the enormous challenges and responsibilities of the Petrine ministry.

"Pope Leo XIV's many years of pastoral experience, his commitment to justice, and his deep spirituality are an example of life lived in service to Jesus Christ. As Anglicans we give thanks for his call to Christians to be bridgebuilders across the divisions of our world, and the divisions that continue to exist between churches. This is something Jesus asks of us. He prays that the Church will be one."

I found a quote from Pope Leo which want to share with you.

"Brothers, sisters, I speak to you, especially to those who no longer believe, no longer hope, no longer pray, because they think that God has left. To those who are fed up with scandals, with misused power, with the silence of a Church that sometimes seems more like a palace than a home.

I, too, was angry with God. I, too, saw good people die, children suffer, grandparents cry without medicine. And yes - there were days when I prayed and only felt an echo. But then I discovered something: God doesn't shout. God whispers. And sometimes He whispers from the mud, from pain, from a grandmother who



feeds you without having anything.

I don't come to offer you perfect faith. I come to tell you that faith is a walk with stones, puddles and unexpected hugs. I'm not asking you to believe in everything. I'm asking you not to close the door. Give a chance to the God who waits for you without judgement.

I'm just a priest who saw God in the smile of a woman who lost her son... and yet she cooked for others. That changed me.

So if you're broken, if you don't believe, if you're tired of the lies.... come anyway. With your anger, your doubt, your dirty backback. No one here will ask for a VIP card. Because this Church, as long as I breathe, will be a home for the homeless, and a rest for the weary.

God does not need soldiers. He needs brothers and sisters. And you, yes, you are one of them."

Kensham Farm

As is now the norm the weather continues to be variable and every season some new weather record is broken; I believe that we've just had the driest March and April on record!

The wheat crops (particularly those that we were able to plant in the very wet autumn) are enjoying the sunshine: the plants are like little solar panels that convert sunlight into energy/growth which in turn converts to yield. However, they also need a regular drink of water which has not been very forthcoming in this dry spring. Some of our fields enjoyed the deluge that occurred on Monday 12th May but unfortunately those heavy showers were very localised and some fields 5 miles away hardly had any rain at all. These localised showers in May and early lune can make a big difference to yield but from the end of June we really want sunshine to ripen the crops and maximise

the protein of the grain.

We are busy spraying the crops with fungicide to protect the plants against disease. Typically, the winter wheat will receive 4 applications of fungicide each season and these are applied to coincide with emergence of the last 3 leaves and the ear as together these contribute to over 90% of the yield. If a wheat plant is riddled with disease such as yellow rust it reduces the green area of the leaf that is available for photosynthesis so the aim is to keep the leaves 'clean and green'.

Most diseases thrive in wet weather and different varieties of wheat have varying

degrees of resistance to the main diseases: yellow rust, brown rust, septoria tritici, mildew (all leaf diseases), eyespot (stem disease) and fusarium ear blight (ear disease that affects grain quality). We only grow milling wheats so our priority when selecting varieties is the end user (flour mill) rather than yield and disease resistance.

For milling wheat (used to make flour for human consumption) the ear fungicide spray is particularly important to protect against fusarium ear blight: this can cause mycotoxins (naturally occurring toxic compounds) in the ear/grains. Prior to delivery to the flour mill the grain has to be tested for mycotoxins and strict thresholds have to be met with the lowest being set for any flour that is used to make baby food. Feed wheat (used for animal feed) does not have to meet any mycotoxin thresholds and so typically feed wheat crops only receive 3 fungicide sprays.

Typically the application rates of fungicide vary from 0.5 to 1.2 litres per hectare (0.2 to 0.5 litres per acre) and we apply with 100 litres per hectare (40 litres per acre) of water.

The sprayer tank holds 4,500 litres so a full tank is enough to spray 45 hectares (about 111 acres). The boom is 30 metres wide (100 feet) and typically we spray at between 12 and 16 km/h. The sprayer is fitted with GPS and can automatically turn off in 0.5 metre increments (60 nozzles at 0.5 metre spacings) to prevent unnecessary wastage and it also has automatic steering. The boom is fitted with ultrasonic sensors that automatically keep it at the correct height



above the crop and allow it to follow ground contours (very necessary in the Chilterns)! The boom is also fitted with individual nozzle led lighting for spraying at night. After the combine harvester the sprayer is the next most expensive machine on our farm.

As with human diseases 'prevention is better than cure' and the same applies to plants. Most fungicides have preventative and curative activity although prevention is always easier/better/cheaper than cure!

Wishing you all a pleasant summer with plenty of sunshine and the odd rain shower (but not in July or August)!



Although we have now over 50 members, we can still squeeze in a few more. If you are interested in joining us please ring Michèle, Choir Manager, on 07795 680253.


