

Welcome

Dear Friends

As I write I'm looking out of my study window in the Rectory on a sunny, if a little crisp, afternoon in mid-March. My thoughts were how long I've longed for a day like today having endured the cold and wet days of winter. It reminded me of how the seasons change not just in nature but geo-politically, socially and spirituality too.

The winds of war blow across the Middle East and uncertainty abounds in the midst of our community. Those who in our villages rely on heating oil are getting worrying invoices from their providers who are immediately passing on costs to their customers. Real people who are known to us are having to stump up large amounts of extra money already in the midst of sustained price rises over the past few years. Rentals in West Wycombe and Bradenham seem to be set at eye-wateringly high levels too.

I'm of an age now when the phrase, 'when I were a lad' seems to slip of the tongue more and more easily. I tell my children, all in their 20's, when I'd get a bag of chips as a youth, wrapped in newspaper, for 15p! Google tells me that nowadays the price is between £2.50 and £4.00! Can you believe it! Money is tight and many feel poorer than we once did. An economic 'winter' is upon us for many with the cost-of-living crisis. Charities like One-Can give us a good outlet to give to the needy.

However, as I said, seasons occur in different dimensions of human experience. There is

a spiritual dimension both for individuals, communities and nations. There is a growing interest in Christianity as Bible sales prove, a near 20% rise since 2024. The Book of Books is the number one bestseller in the history of the world with 5-6 billion copies sold.

Although seasons change, certain events come around year by year that give us solidity in our culture, often these link with the natural seasons. For us, the season which coincides with Spring is Easter. At Easter, Christians celebrate the core event of our faith, namely the Resurrection. Thought to be a myth by some, but not by Jesus' disciples who died believing they had seen him gloriously alive. For them and through their testimony us, this was the definitive proof that Jesus was who he claimed to be.

May you have a Happy Easter despite some of the worries and concerns that surround us and enjoy the holidays.



News from St Paul's Church

The first days of April come in the middle of Holy Week – the most important week of the Christian year. It begins on the last Sunday of March, Palm Sunday when we remember Jesus entering Jerusalem with the crown singing Hosanna. We receive palm crosses, like the palms that the people waved, but now we have to learn the meaning of the cross.

While Jesus was in Jerusalem early in the week the leaders were waiting for their opportunity to arrest Jesus and worked to turn the people against him.

Maudy Thursday 2nd April at St Paul's, West Wycombe 6.30pm

We come together for a Eucharist and we remember how Jesus spent his last night with his disciples when he washed their feet and asked them to remember him always by sharing bread and wine. Our time will end as we think about his prayer in the garden of Gethsemane and strip our altar remembering how Jesus is taken away for his trial and his friends desert him.

Easter Sunday 5th April at St Paul's, West Wycombe 11.00am



We come together to celebrate Jesus' glorious resurrection with a eucharist – together with lots of Alleluias, daffodils and chocolate eggs.

St Paul's Bledlow Ridge will be open for private prayer and the village are invited to share in the Easter message of new life by placing a daffodil on the cross at the gate.

There will be a Eucharist at St Paul's on Sunday 19th April at 9.30am.

As this is written we do not know how the state of the world will have changed by the time these words are read but whatever has happened our thoughts and prayers will be with all the people affected by the war in the Middle East and our prayer is for peace for our world.

The hot news from the cricket club this month is that the new outdoor nets project which has been a year in the planning, has now been completed.

It started with a fundraising auction last April followed by various other initiatives through the summer which took us to our target. Our thanks to all those who made donations and to those attended the auction and other events. Club volunteers demolished the old structure in February and we are grateful to all those who then helped remove the spoil and other materials.

Contractors Dura Sport completed the state-of-the-art project in just eight days. The nets are intended to provide the best practice facilities for batters, bowlers and wicketkeepers alike and the netting design means that balls cannot escape at the rear or into the adjacent lane.

By the time you read this and weather permitting, we will have launched the nets with the first session in our six-week Academy Development programme. This is for our 15-25 year olds with coaches from High Wycombe. The initiative is designed to develop our talented group of youngsters who of course represent the club's future.

We ask all members and villagers to respect the new facility and to only enter the area to practise and wearing appropriate flat-soled footwear. No children (unless practising) no dogs and no food please!

Junior Cricket

Talking of youngsters: First Juniors practice and registration is Friday 17th April, and Allstars and Dynamos starts on 15th May. More than 80 matches have been arranged across 9 age groups.

The Senior season

Senior pre-league season matches start on Saturday 18th April and continue through to the first league fixtures for our three teams on Saturday 9th May. Country Notes

After a gloomy grey winter March rushed in with sunny warm days and suddenly there were brimstone butterflies and ladybirds everywhere and the first blobs of frogspawn in the pond.

Shiny green bluebell leaf spikes have been gradually emerging from the woodland leaf litter so we can look forward to the gorgeous scent of those purple blue flowers by the end of April. Some chiffchaffs overwinter in the UK but most migrate about 3000 miles from the Mediterranean and Northern Africa. When you hear that

persistent “chiffchaffing” song in March it feels like confirmation that Spring has arrived. Swallows fly twice the distance from South Africa usually arriving here at the beginning of April. Often it’s their twittering song overhead which makes you look up to catch your first sight of these agile speedy fliers.

The Boot at Bledlow Ridge
The Boot was granted its licence in 1842 and the current building dates from the early 19th century although there have been a few alterations. The original building was set back further from the road.

The Boot is the only pub left in the village now, but at one time there were as many as four or even five. If you head towards Chinnor before the end of the village there was a pub called The Two Brewers which burnt down at the beginning of the 1900's. It is now a private dwelling.

In the opposite direction towards Wycombe first would have been The Light Dragoon which closed its doors in the 1920's. Second you would have arrived at The White Mouse which was in The City near the cricket field. It also is now a private dwelling.

Since the mid part of the 19th Century The Boot was tied to a brewery which was Simmonds of Reading, later becoming Courage then sold onto Morland's of Oxford in the late 1980's. Sadly Morland's went into receivership in 1998 with many of their properties being sold off. Even then the brewery attempted to convert the site into 3 houses, but it was stopped on appeal from the village.

Our name – “The Boot”



So why is the pub in Bledlow Ridge called The Boot? Of course, many of these tales are based on legend so cannot be authenticated exactly. However, there are potentially two reasons. Both are associated with a parish priest of North Marston in Bucks, John Schorne, dating back to 1290 – 1314. First, he is attributed with discovering a well, whose waters were reputed to have miraculous properties. The waters were thought to cure ague and other ailments and folk travelled from far and wide to avail themselves creating, some say, a medieval religious cult. As the pilgrimage to the well

grew many houses on route started serving beer as refreshment to the pilgrims, with several calling their place 'The Boot'.

Also, John Schorne's reputation for holiness was such that he is believed to have cast the devil into a boot as part of his preaching thus bringing peace to the village. His remains were later moved from North Marston to St George's Chapel, Windsor, the burial place of English monarchs.

There was also a rector in Princes Risborough in c1289 called John de Schorne who could well have been the same person. Hence another close link to the village of Bledlow Ridge.

Dates for your diary:

Village Easter Party Saturday 4th April – a treat of BBQ Greek style lamb pitta with roast potatoes and salad - £12 plus there is a live local band, The Barnstormers, who many of you will know, treating customers to an evening of music and dancing! They will do an early evening set at about 6pm and also later about 8ish for the later starters!





The Department for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs (DEFRA) define a rural community as people living in areas with fewer than 10,000 residents. So, if you live in a village or a rural area, please tell Healthwatch Bucks what works for you and what could make it easier for you to access any health or social care such as dentists, hospitals, and respite care.

Healthwatch Bucks would also like to have small group discussions with 6 to 12 people, especially if you're not comfortable using a computer to fill out our survey. Please call them on 01494 324832 if you would be interested in hosting a group to talk in more detail about this subject.

Healthwatch Bucks will write a report summarising what they have been told. It will include recommendations about what would make accessing health and social care rural in Bucks better.

Upgrading your electricity network

Essential works between Stokenchurch and High Wycombe Starting early 2026

Dear resident,

Scottish and Southern Electricity Networks (SSEN), together with delivery partner OCU Group, will shortly begin work to upgrade the local electricity network between Stokenchurch and High Wycombe.

Part of a multi-million pound investment in Buckinghamshire, the works form part of SSEN's wider ED2 investment programme – a long-term, regional upgrade designed to strengthen electricity infrastructure, support sustainable growth and help support the transition to decarbonisation.

Beginning in early 2026, the project will install a new 33kV underground electricity cable between Stokenchurch Substation and High Wycombe Substation, helping to improve the reliability and capacity of power supplies for homes, businesses and public services across the area. The new cable will improve network capacity and resilience, ensuring the local electricity network can meet growing demand now and in the future.

Why this investment is needed

Electricity is playing an increasingly important role in our daily lives, from how we heat our homes to how we travel. Buckinghamshire is also growing rapidly, with thousands of new homes, businesses and public services needing reliable, sustainable power.

Where will work take place?

The new underground cable route is approximately 13.5 kilometres (8.4 miles) long and will run:

- From Stokenchurch Substation, Marlow Road (B482).
- Through Stokenchurch and along key local roads including sections of the A40.
- To High Wycombe Substation, Coronation Road.


The majority of the works will take place within the highway, with only short sections carried out at any one time to reduce disruption.

When will the project start and how long will it take?

Starting from Stokenchurch Substation in early 2026, the first phase of works will continue through to West Wycombe. Works will take place Monday-Sunday, 8:00am-5:00pm, and completion is anticipated in 2027.

What can I expect during the works?

We understand that roadworks can be disruptive. We are working closely with Buckinghamshire Council and other stakeholders to minimise inconvenience wherever possible. During the works you can expect:

- Temporary traffic management, including traffic lights in place 24/7 where required.
- Clear signage in advance of works.
- Works planned in short sections to keep disruption localised.

Will my power be cut off?

There are no planned power interruptions as part of these works. If you rely on electricity for health or care needs, you can register for SSEN's free Priority Services Register to receive additional support.

Kensham Farms

Since I last wrote I am relieved to say that we successfully passed our Red Tractor inspection with no advisories.

With the weather turning more spring like we have been able to get on the fields and begin spreading fertiliser, spraying and replanting the odd area with spring wheat where the autumn sown crop had failed.

The main fertilisers we apply in the spring are nitrogen and sulphur. Nitrogen is crucial for plant growth, chlorophyll production and leaf stem development. It is important that this is applied in the right quantities and at the correct time. We buy our nitrogen as Urea (46% N) as opposed to Ammonium Nitrate (34.5% N). Because Urea is more concentrated than Ammonium Nitrate we don't need to apply such a large amount. The first low-rate application (usually late February to mid-March) is to help the wheat to tiller (produce more leaves) and to stimulate root growth. The bulk of the nitrogen will be applied during April to coincide with the maximum period of growth (stem extension).

The crops also need sulphur and this has become more prevalent as the atmospheric deposition of sulphur has declined, due to less exhaust emissions from cars and cleaner power stations. Sulphur is needed for enzyme, amino acid and vitamin

creation. Like nitrogen it also plays a crucial role in chlorophyll production and photosynthesis. The crops don't require as much sulphur as nitrogen and will receive just one application during March. We apply ammonium sulphate which contains both nitrogen and sulphur. All our fertiliser is purchased in 1 tonne sling bags and then we load the fertiliser spreader with the telescopic loader.

Luckily, I agreed the price of the fertiliser in June 2025 (even though it was not delivered until January 2026) as urea has now increased by nearly 70% due to the war in Iran. Most urea manufacturing is carried out in the middle east due to the abundance



of cheap natural gas which is essential for producing ammonia: the building block of urea. Readers will well know that the war has also had a massive inflationary effect on the cost of any fuel.

Our Amazone ZGTS fertiliser spreader has many technological features to enable accurate application. The flow of fertiliser from the spreading discs is monitored by radar sensors which automatically adjusts the delivery system to ensure accurate



distribution to compensate for slope or varying fertiliser quality.

The spreader also has 'section control' which is an automated GPS system that adjusts the spreader width in 32 increments to prevent overlaps and to turn on and off on headlands. This boosts efficiency by reducing wastage and ensuring accurate application.

The spreader also has weigh cells on the chassis that continually weigh the amount of fertiliser in the hopper to make sure the correct rate is being applied. The application rate is kept constant regardless of forward speed and this gives the machine a huge work rate: the highest daily output we have recorded was 650 acres ! The hopper



holds 7 tonnes of fertiliser which is enough to spread 140 acres at the early season low rate.

All this technology comes at a price with this machine costing £68,000 in 2020 and with inflation would now be over £100,000.


